UNIVERSITY OF TARTU – INFORMATION FOR INCOMING EXCHANGE STUDENTS

The information given applies to students who are nominated as exchange students to the University of Tartu (UT) by their home university within inter-university cooperation agreement, to study here for a semester or two. All students who have been nominated by their home institution must submit their application documents to UT.

1. Application documents and requirements

The list of required documents and relevant forms are available at: www.ut.ee/en/prospective-students/exchange-students.

- 1. **Online application form** after submitting the online application form, it must be printed out (PDF document) and signed by home institution's coordinator and by a student;
- 2. **Transcript of records** issued by home university (in English, must bear an original seal and signature of an authorized official);
- 3. **Copy of valid identification document** (non EU applicants a copy of the passport page stating the applicant's personal particulars);
- 4. **One photo** (3 cm x 4 cm; attach to the application form);
- 5. **Proof of English language skills** (not applicable for native speakers and students of the universities where English is the language of instruction).

Exchange students whose primary language is not English must meet **level B2 requirements** for English proficiency according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Please view these requirements here: European Levels - Self Assessment Grid.

Documented evidence is needed to demonstrate student's English language proficiency. This could include an official letter from a language instructor at student's home university stating that student's English skills are sufficient to study abroad. If student has taken an international test of the English language (TOEFL, IELTS, etc.), please send us a copy of the test score. TOEFL iBT score must be at least 69/70; minimum IELTS score: 5.5.

Students must submit their online application form both electronically, as well as by regular mail. Online application system is open within the period from March 15 to June 2 and September 15 to November 2. Students will be provided with usernames and passwords, so that they can monitor their admission process online.

2. Deadlines for applications:

All documents (hard copies) must be sent by regular mail to: International Student Service, University of Tartu, Ülikooli 18-132, 50090 Tartu, Estonia.

NB! Application documents (hard copies) must arrive to the International Student Service by the deadlines indicated above.

Once students have submitted all required documents, UT will inform them about admission (within 4 weeks after the application deadline) and provide further information. Information about visas/residence permits and necessary documents for visa/residence permit applications will be sent along with the admission letter.

4. Courses

The University of Tartu offers many English-taught courses in different disciplines for international students. Exchange students are free to select courses from different programmes and faculties to design their study plans for the coming semester. The list of courses taught in English is available at http://www.ut.ee/en/courses-taught-english. Timetables of the courses will be available at the beginning of the semester in the Study Information System.

NB! The list of courses taught in English in next autumn semester will be available on our website by the end of March.

Exchange students are required to take courses for at least 15 ECTS per semester.

The **non-intensive** Estonian language course for beginners is available for all international students. The university's Language Centre also offers courses for those interested in studying the Russian language; however, the courses will only be opened in case there are enough students ready to participate.

Please remember that UT has the right to cancel courses due to unforeseen circumstances and in case there are less students attending the course than anticipated. The minimum number of attendants is assigned for each course and is fixed in Study Information System.

5. Accommodation

Along with the admission letter, students will also receive instructions as how to apply for accommodation in one of the university's dormitories. All students are guaranteed a place in a twin room at one of the dormitories; however, they still need to apply for housing following guidelines they find in the admission package.

NB! Housing in the dormitory is guaranteed only if student's application documents for studies at UT arrive to the International Student Service by indicated application deadlines.

An important aspect to keep in mind is that all students, including exchange students, are required to pay a refundable deposit fee for their housing, the amount of that is 80 Euros. It will be refunded to students unless there are some property damage caused and the deposit money is used to cover the cost of repair.

6. Orientation Course

At the beginning of each semester, International Student Service offers an orientation course for all international students. Orientation course takes place about a week before the beginning of a semester and it includes:

- Meeting the representatives of the university and International Student Service;
- Introduction to the university's study system;
- Tour of the university, the library and the town in general;
- Meeting the tutors.

7. Tutors

Tutors are students who help newly arrived students to adapt into academic environment at the University of Tartu. They are ready to give additional guidance and information on several matters, varying from studies to living conditions in Tartu. All international students are divided into small groups and each group has a tutor. Students will be contacted by their tutor before the beginning of the semester by email.

8. Arrival

International students usually arrive at Tartu or Tallinn Airport or Tallinn Harbour. Buses from Tallinn Bus Terminal to Tartu depart twice an hour on average and the trip takes about 2,5 hours.
